4. What can you offer to the cooperative as a director?

I want to make ArchiTEAM more relevant and more member-focused than it has ever been. I have a Practice Director for over 12 years, and I bring along all my accumulated experience which includes teaching in academia, being an examiner with the ARBV. I'm also "more than an architect", through my roles in academia; being an examiner with the ARBV but also my involvement with community soccer clubs and recently as martial arts instructor (at my BJJ club) – not to mention my previous role as a co-convener for the best* conference that ArchiTEAM has ever put together during the most unprecedented time of our lives.

I navigate the challenges you face daily, but together we can all achieve what we all want – sustainable small to medium architectural practice that is well-supported and well-represented.

I want your vote so I can help all members achieve this through ArchiTEAM.

5. Why do you want to be an ArchiTEAM director?

I am seeking your vote to represent you as one of the ArchiTEAM Board Directors. I would love to put my skills, experience and passion to use for the benefit of <u>all members</u>.

The profession is at a precipice, and ArchiTEAM can play a central role to navigate this.

We all want to be part of an ArchiTEAM that is bigger than Victorian / Melbourne-centric. We have the potential to grow and be seen as the <u>national peak professional body for small the medium sized architectural practices</u>, with branches in other states. There is **strength in numbers** for small to medium sized practices.

ArchiTEAM can play a role, in tandem with aligned professional bodies (including the Association of Consulting Architects and others) to advocate for the value and need of architectural practice in the community at large. Each ArchiTEAM member holds expertise about the practice and business of architecture that allows us to influence outcomes beyond our interests.



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A better-informed community means better conditions for us to practice, but also better built environment outcomes.

At the coalface, it seems like most practices are hurting - it feels like a depression that no economist wants to come out and declare.

The race to the bottom has to stop! ArchiTEAM needs to join forces with other aligned professional bodies to advocate for better engagement conditions and better procurement models that take race-to-the-bottom 'lowest cost' out of the equation, and instead engage based on our understanding of 'risk'.

Too many of us have worked on projects for state and local government clients, and often our fees have not kept pace with the services and timeframes demanded. Given the context, it is not too acerbic to say that architects, including ArchiTEAM members, should remind the public of the inordinate value that we transfer - and that it is worth paying for. Those of you who are cynics, you may ask, "who is paying who"? - this also needs to stop!

Just like the Japanese folklore tale of "The One Inch Boy", ArchiTEAM and our members are don't necessarily want to become "bigger", but we do want to be seen as "less small". We have strength in numbers; strength in small practice and a chorus of voices working as a collective, including with our allies in other professional bodies.

Your vote is powerful.

With your support as an elected ArchiTEAM Director, I will do whatever I can to pursue that this strength be realized – for the benefit of <u>all members</u>.

6. What do you see as the purpose of ArchiTEAM?

Act as a corporate organization for the benefit of all members.

Represent small, medium and emerging Australian architectural practices, and registered architects in each Australian state and territory.

Engage with the community at large as to the benefit and value of engaging an architect for their built environment project.

As a membership organization, represent all members and their interests so effect better built-environment outcomes, and stronger relationships with government, industry and the public at large.

7. What do you think ArchiTEAM should be doing in future that it is not already doing?

1) Work with other Professional Bodies to advocate to State and Local Governments that they should engage consultants based on 'Risk' and not on 'Cost'. A much more level and fair playing field needs to be brought back into industry, as the constant 'race to the bottom' is destroying practices at the expense of considered built environment outcomes and user experience.

2) Grow ArchiTEAM as a corporate entity with branches in other state. Based on the membership information, there are members in other states and being a Victorian / Melbourne-centric organization is limiting our potential membership base; our engagement with members; the types of events and offerings available (and where) but also; our visibility as a professional body that advocates to the public the value of architectural services.



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3) Offer more CPD that focuses on the high risk in practice. This is based on trends observed from the ArchiTEAM Members Only Facebook page topics (as well as the core AACA Architectural Practice Competencies tested at registration) that are regularly posted, including the "high risk" areas of Design Management; Budget Planning; Tort and Negligence Avoidance; Tendering and Procurement as well as Client Architect Agreement Management. Most of these practice areas are 'learned on the job' but smaller practices need to leverage the collegiate profession rather than their own internal staff and acumen on how to handle these. The small to medium sized practices that ArchiTEAM represents need to be part of a network of aligned practices and a supporting professional body to gain practice acumen to navigate 'high risk' practice areas, giving more confidence to the public at large in engaging with architects in the first place.

4) Promoting the fantastic work ArchiTEAM already does, beyond the Awards and Conference Programme. This could be a newsletter after each Board Meeting; updates on any research partnerships and their progress; changes to insurance and any advocacy that has been carried out on behalf of members. This will grow the culture of inclusion, trust and transparency for all members to be involved.

5) Create a culture of accountability and awareness within our collegiate professional body. We need to remove anonymity within the ArchiTEAM Members Facebook Page to restore trust and confidence within our profession. This needs to be replaced with a panel of Experienced Architects, who can provide confidential and tailored support – managed by the ArchiTEAM Cooperative.

8. What do you wish to achieve in your 2 year term on the ArchiTEAM board?

Attempt to:

- Ensure that ArchiTEAM continues to operate well and be well-managed, and financed.
- Work well with ArchiTEAM Cooperative Management and all Board Directors, and support each other in our roles.
- Help ArchiTEAM embark on establishing branches in other states to grow the Cooperative.
- Work with aligned professional membership organizations to promote better awareness of the value of the profession to the community; industry and government.
- Share more of the 'good news' stories that the ArchiTEAM Cooperative does behind the scenes and share these with the members at large.
- Remove posting anonymously on the ArchiTEAM Members Facebook Page to promote a culture of accountability and professional prudence, and replace this with an Experienced Practitioner Panel
- Create a culture of practice awareness within the membership body of the high-risk architectural services
- Leave ArchiTEAM in a stronger position than when I joined.
