5. Why do you want to be an ArchiTEAM director?

Currently looking for a new community governance position with either a not-for-profit or professional body. Would be a great opportunity to develop further corporate governance experience, practice leadership skills and develop other skills (and networks) within personal and professional life.

I would like the opportunity to work within ArchiTEAM to effect better advocacy of the value and need for architectural practice in the community at large, and to work with other aligned organizations including the Association of Consulting Architects (and others) to lobby State and Local Governments on how they can better procure architectural and professional services based on 'risk' rather than 'lowest cost'.

6. What do you see as the purpose of ArchiTEAM?

Act as a corporate organization for the benefit of all members.

Represent small, medium and emerging Australian architectural practices, and registered architects in each Australian state and territory.

Engage with the community at large as to the benefit and value of engaging an architect for their built environment project. As a membership organization, represent members and their interests to the built-environment industry and government.



7. What do you think ArchiTEAM should be doing in future that it is not already doing?

Focus on engaging with State and Local Governments on how architects and built-environment professionals are procured, shifting to a focus on 'risk' rather than using 'cost' a primary or largest benchmark for engagement criteria – as it is currently hurting the industry at large on continually following the 'race to the bottom' at the expense of considered built environment outcomes, user experience with working with architects and the business prospects of architectural practices.

Based on the ArchiTEAM Members Only Facebook page topics, promote greater focus on Professional Practice and Risk Management awareness amongst its members including in the "high risk" areas of Design Managemen; Budget Planning; Tort and Negligence Avoidance; Tendering and Procurement as well as Client Architect Agreement Management. Most of these practice areas are 'learned on the job' which is fine for architects in larger practices greater than themselves to rely on a body of knowledge and acumen, but small practices (like those who ArchiTEAM represents) need to be part of a network of aligned practices and a supporting professional body to gain practice acumen to navigate 'high risk' practice areas, giving more confidence to the public at large in engaging with architects in the first place.

Promoting the fantastic work ArchiTEAM already does, beyond the Awards and Conference Programme. This could include any research partnerships and their progress, changes to insurance and any advocacy that has been carried out on behalf of members.

Removing anonymity within the ArchiTEAM Members Facebook Page and creating a culture of accountability, transparency and awareness within the collegiate body.

8. What do you wish to achieve in your 2 year term on the ArchiTEAM board?

Attempt to:

- Help ArchiTEAM to continue to operate well and be well-managed, and financed.
- Work with aligned professional membership organizations to promote better awareness of the value of the profession to the community; industry and government.
- Assess what 'good news' stories that the ArchiTEAM Cooperative do embark upon and share these with the members at large.
- Remove posting anonymously on the ArchiTEAM Members Facebook Page to promote a culture of accountability and professional prudence.
- Create a culture of practice awareness within the membership body of the high-risk architectural practice
- Leave ArchiTEAM in a better place than when I joined (if elected).
