Ongoing and strengthened advocacy for the role of architects in helping to address the critical challenges of our times; the climate emergency, the regulatory, building, procurement and larger macro economic environment, the increase of Al, and the perceived 'devaluing' of the profession amongst the other professions within the broader construction industry. ArchiTeam has an important role to play in ensuring the profession does its bit, and in providing support and advocacy both for the members, but also the profession more broadly.

I hope to contribute positively to ArchiTeam's supportive and engaged membership. I would like to work collaboratively with the other directors and staff to help support and nourish this wonderful community.
